The Yak Festival (in the last week of July): The Yak Festival is held in the last week of July in Bat Ulzii village (sum) of Ovorkhangai province, which is considered as the motherland of yaks, with cooperation's of yak herders and yak down product producers. During the festival activities such as, yak parade, yak race, a fashion show and an exhibition of yak down products will be organized. Visit a Yak breeder's family and experience the traditional customs and lifestyle of local residents. Övörkhangai /Uvurkhangai (Mongolian: Θβθρχαμγαμ, Öwörhangai; "southern Khangai") is one of the 21 aimags (provinces) of Mongolia, located in the south of the country. Its capital is Arvaikheer. The Erdene Zuu monastery and Karakorum, the ancient capital of the Mongol Empire are located in this province.

The Yak Festival is one of the most important festivals in Mongolia. It's held each year on the 23rd of July in Orkhon Valley, in Bat Ulzii sum, province of Ovorkhangai. In Mongolia, the yak has a great value for nomadic breeders. It has many uses and is necessary for the good development of a farm. The yak can carry equipment on its back or tract a cart. Its wood is used for doing clothes, and, as any animal, its meat and milk are eaten.

The main purpose of the festival is to promote the yak herder nomads, improve and increase the benefits of the yak related products, introduce the yak culture to the public, and attract tourists.













The main events of the Yak Festival are:

- 1. The opening speech of a local governor followed by yak parade and performance.
- 2. Yak lassoing (the participants lasso a yak from an untrained herd of yaks).
- 3. Yak training (the participants ride and train the yaks they lasso).
- 4. Team competition of the yak herders (the competition type differs).
- 5. Polo sport while riding yaks (could be some of the most interesting and fun sport. Yak is a strong animal among the other animals of the nomads).
- 6. Yak racing (the Yak Festival tends to be a fun activity and could be some of the slowest races. Almost half of the yaks reach the finish line walking or barely trotting).
- 7. Best yak product competition (dairy products, yak hair/skin/horn products, and all new ideas or creativity).
- 8. A demonstration of yak wool rope making (the rope plays in an important role for the nomadic housing and animal tethering).
- 9. Demonstration of yak dairy product making (you will see how many different types of products the nomads produce).
- 10. The Yak Festival closes by the competition winner prizes.













About Mongol Yak: There are approximately 1,005,000 yaks in 13 provinces of Mongolia. Thus, Mongolia has the world's second-largest yak heads in the world. The world yak population is 14.2 million. The mountainous yak habitat areas of Arkhangai, Uvurkhangai, Khuvsgul, Bayan-Ulgii, Uvs, and Khovd provinces are among the top tourist destinations in Mongolia. Not only the mountainous northern and western regions of Mongolia. The yaks are in mountainous areas of the Gobi Desert such as Bayankhongor, Zavkhan, and Gobi Altai provinces. The yaks were domesticated relatively late and their isolated mountainous pastureland influences the animal's strong characters.













Tour Highlights: This journey designed especially for groups, families, and funny travel. First at all, we visit the 40-meter (~133, 3 feet) Statue of ``Genghis or Chinggis Khaan´´, visitors walk to the head of the horse through its chest and neck of the horse, where they can have a panoramic view. The attached museum has exhibitions relating to the Bronze Age and Xiongnu archaeological cultures in Mongolia, which show everyday utensils, belt buckles, knives, sacred animals, etc. and a second exhibition on the Great Khan period in the 13 and 14th centuries which has goldsmith subjects and some Nestorian crosses and rosaries. Gorkhi/Tereli National Park-is one of the most popular national parks in Mongolia. Gorkhi/Terelj features stunning granite mountains and flowery endless grassy green meadows. This picturesque National Park is a part of Khan Khentii Strictly Protected Area. It is a great place for hiking, trekking, even you can rock climb here at its natural steep granite walls. Drive towards west to see the **Authentic Mongol Nomad Show**. It demonstrates traditional living way of real Mongolian nomads and breeding and using of five kinds of livestock and movement from one place to another using ox, yak, camel and horse carts which are the carts. Nex, drive west to visit the Elsen Tasarkhai (also known as Bayangobi desert or Mini-Gobi)-is a part of the 80kms/50miles long Mongol Els Sand Dunes and is located on about 280kms west from the capital Ulaanbaatar. The nature in this area is really spectacular and great for relaxing. Enjoy to ride two-humped Bactrian camel. Walk on sand dunes, experience staying in a traditional Mongolian dwelling ger, and walk and relax in beautifully serene nature. Enjoy the sunset. Drive towards west to **Karakorum**-is located about 430kms/ west from the capital Ulaanbaatar in Ovorkhangai province. This is the ``Genghis (Chinggis)'' Khan's 13th century capital and heart of the mighty Mongolian Empire and Okhon river Valley- is located along the Orkhon River in Ovorkhangai and Arkhangai Provinces, was the center of the Mongol Empire, the center of the Uighur Empire, and the












birthplace of Mongolian Buddhism. Visitors, such as Marco Polo, described its ornate building, including a 2500 sq. meters Palace of Worldly Peace. Today, **the cultural heritage of the Okhon river valley** constitutes a **UNESCO World Heritage**.

Enjoy the Yak Festival is one of the most important festivals in Mongolia. It's held each year on the **23rd of July** in Orkhon Valley, in Bat Ulzii sum, province of Ovorkhangai. Its wood is used for doing clothes, and, as any animal, its meat and milk are eaten. We will head North to Orkhon Waterfall. The Orkhon river derives its name from the Old Turkic prefix "or" meaning "middle", and "khan" or king. It rises in the **Khangai Mountains** in the Tsenkher sum (local town) of Arkhangai province at the foot of the Suvraga Khairkhan mountain. From there, it crosses the border into Uvurkhangai province and follows the upper Orkhon valley in an eastern direction until it reaches Karakorum. On this stretch, very close to the Orkhon, the Ulaan Tsutgalan river features a waterfall, ten metres (33 ft) wide and twenty metres (66 ft) high, which is a popular destination for tourists. With 1,124 km (698 mi), the Orkhon is longer than the Selenge, making it the longest river in Mongolia. UNESCO lists the Orkhon Valley as a World Heritage Site. Next, departure in the direction of the Turkish Memorial Museum (Khushuu Tsaidam) in the Orkhon River Valley, erected in honor of the Turkish princes of the early 8th century Bilge Khan and Kul Tigin with their Orkhon inscriptions, which are admitted as the most impressive monuments of the nomads of the Gokturk Empire. The Bilge Qaghan and Kul Tigin monuments were found in the UNESCO World Heritage Site of the Orkhon Valley Cultural Landscape, 47 km (1 hour drive by paved road, funded by the Turkish Government) northwest of Kharkhorin (Karakorum). The museum was built in cooperation with the Turkish Cooperation and Coordination Agency in 2008. For better conservation of the monuments, they were brought to the museum and copies of them were placed in the places where they were originally found. Enjoy the **Ugii Lake** is located in the province of Uvurkhangai, where many migratory birds arrive at certain times of the year due to the abundance of fish. It is of great importance as a breeding and stopping place for waterfowl. In the last, drive towards to explore Hustain Nuruu Wild Horses National Park (hustai is Mongolian for birch and nuruu means mountains) measures about 57,000 hectares, or including the buffer zone 120.000 ha., and is located on about 120kms/62 miles west from the capital Ulaanbaatar.

The flagship species for the **Hustain Nuruu Nature Reserve** is the reintroduced Przewalski or takhi horse. **We would be pleased to have you join us!**

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DAY BY DAY ITINERARY:

19 July, Day 1: Arrival in Ulaanbaatar/Ulaanbaatar Grand Tour/Welcome Lunch (L)

Day 1-Upon your arrival in Ulaanbaatar `` Genghis Khan´´ New Airport and after custom formalities and baggage claim, you will be met by Samar Magic Tours team and taken to the centrally located hotel in Ulaanbaatar (*by hotels policy the check-in time is after 02:00PM/14:00). Ulaanbaatar Great City tour: visit the Gandantegchinlen Monastery is a Tibetan-style Buddhist monastery that has been restored and revitalized since 1990. The Tibetan name translates to the "Great Place of Complete Joy". It currently has over 150 monks in residence. It features a 26.5-meter-high statue of Avalokitesvara. It came under state protection in 1994. 10:00AM-Here you will have the opportunity to attend a Buddhist ceremony. Next, we will visit a small











museum of dinosaur fossils. The centerpiece of the museum is the 4m-tall, 3-ton ultraviolet Tarbosaurus bataar (cousin of Tyrannosaurus rex) and a smaller Saurolophus, with its distinctive cranial crest. The Tarbosaurus bataar made international headlines in 2012, when it sold at an auction in Texas. The Mongolian Government protested that the fossil had been illegally removed from Mongolia and demanded its return. The legal battle ended when a US judge ruled in favor of Mongolia. Nicolas Cage has agreed to return a rare dinosaur skull to the Mongolian government. The Oscar-winning actor bought the Tyrannosaurus bataar skull in 2007, not knowing it had been stolen. Authorities said he voluntarily agreed to hand over the skull after learning of the circumstances. The museum also includes examples of Velociraptor and Protoceratops, and a nest of Oviraptor eggs. It is located inside the former Lenin Museum, built in 1974. Next, visit the **Sukh** Baatar Main Square to see a large statue of the Genghis Khan-inaugurated in 2006 on the occasion of 800th Anniversary of the Great Mongolian Empire of Genghis Khan (1206-2006), the Sukh Baatar Hero along with The Parliament House, Stock Exchange, the Drama Theatre and the Palace of Culture. Visit the National History Museum-where you will see artefacts from Mongolia and Central Asia from the Stone Age to the present. Welcome lunch in traditional local restaurant. Next, visit the New Museum "Genghis Kan" ("Chinggis Khaan"), opened in the month of Octubre 11-2022. The museum is designed to show the history of the Mongol kings from the reign of King Hunnu Modun Shanyu to the abdication of the Eighth Jebtsundamba.


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20 July, Day 2: The Genghis Khan Statue/Gorkhi/Terelj National Park/Ulaanbaatar (B)(L)

Breakfast. 09:00AM-Meet Samar Magic Tours team at reception of the hotel. Drive towards to visit the 40 meter /~133,3 feet Genghis Khan Statue on horseback (55km/34miles, +1.30 hrs) N/E of the Mongolian capital Ulaanbaatar. The statue is symbolically pointed east towards his birthplace. It is on top of the **Genghis Khan Statue Complex**, a visitor center, itself 10 meters (32 ft 10 in) tall, with 36 columns representing the 36 khans from Genghis to Ligdan Khan. Visitors walk to the head of the horse through its chest and neck of the horse, where they can have a panoramic view. Near the Great Statue of **Genghis Khan**, we can take beautiful photos with the Kazakhs and their Golden Eagles, rides on the backs of Bactrian camels, or rides on Mongolian horses through the steppes, shooting with a bow and arrow (*extra payment at the same place). Mongolian lunch is included on the way. After, continuous drive north further to reach Gorkhi/Terelj National Park (50km/ 31 miles, 1.00 hr). Seeing grasslands and beautiful vistas. The valley is about 20kms/12miles long at 1600m. This picturesque National Park is a part of Khan Khentii Strictly Protected Area. It is a great place for hiking, trekking, even you can rock climb here at its natural steep granite walls. Explore the Turtle shaped original giant rock - symbol of Gorkhi/Terelj National Park. Walking & Easy Trekking to Arryabal Meditation Temple, on the top of the small hill. Drive back to Ulaanbaatar (70km/ 44 miles, 2.00 hrs). Transfer to hotel. Overnight at selected and confirmed hotel. Dinner is not included.





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21 July, Day 3-Authentic Mongol Nomadic Show-Bayangobi Desert (MiniGobi)-Bactrian Camel riding-Karakorum (Central Mongolia). (B)(L)(D)

Breakfast. 08:00AM-Meet Samar Magic Tours team at reception of the hotel. Drive towards west to observe the Authentic Mongol Nomaic Show (about 35-40km/25miles, 1.30 hrs). It demonstrates traditional living way real Mongolian nomads and breeding and using of five kinds of livestock and movement from one place to another using ox, yak, camel and horse carts which are the carts. Here you will have the opportunity to hear a Mongolian folk song, to see 5 herding animals, to observe the demonstration of catching and milking sheep, goat, to observe the demonstration of making dairy products. Also, we will see the Mongolian archery, playing













traditional games, the demonstration of making felt and tanning, the demonstration of moving one place to another use by cart, yak freight, camel and horse carts. Continuous drive **West** to **Elsen Tasarkhai Dunes (known as the Bayangobi desert or MiniGobi**, about 280 km/174 miles, 4hours drive), desert sand dunes spread over 80kms in a beautiful valley. Opportunity for hiking, walking through the dunes, and photographing the landscapes. **Excursion included to cross the dunes on the back of a Bactrian camel.** Continuous drive to **Karakorum** (about 150 km/94 miles, 2 hrs) in Central Mongolia-the **Genghis (Chinggis) Khan's 13th century capital and heart of the mighty Mongolian Empire and Okhon river Valley, cradle of Mongolian civilization.** Visitors, such as **Marco Polo**, described its ornate building, including a 2500 sq. meters Palace of Worldly Peace. Overnight in Tourist Gers Camp.


























23 July, Day 4-Monument to the Mongol States-Erdene zuu Monastery-Karakorum Museum-Orkhon Valley. (B)(L)(D)

Breakfast. **09:00AM**-Meet **Samar Magic Tours** team. Next, we will visit the **Monument to the Mongol States** located on a hill overlooking the city of **Karakorum (Kharkhorin)**, on the bank of the **Orkhon River**. It was built in 2004. The monument consists of a large pile of stones (a shamanic ovoo) carefully assembled into a cone shape, approximately the same size as a tipi, with nine posts protruding from the top. This structure is mounted on a stone and concrete platform and is surrounded by three walls that represent three sections of a circle. The outer sides of these walls feature three colorful mosaics representing three maps, one for each of the empires.

- **1.** First, there was the **Xiongnu Empire**, a confederation of nomadic tribes that lived on the steppes from about the 3rd century BC. until the 1st century AD.
- **2.** The **Turkish Khaganate Empire** followed, established by the Göktürks in 682 and lasting only until 744.
- **3.** Finally, and famously, **Genghis Khan** founded the **Mongol Empire** of the 13th and 14th centuries.













The iconic place of the Mongol Empire in culture, combined with the shamanic symbolism of the **ovoo** at the center of the monument, prompts people to leave offerings of vodka, milk, tea, rice and other edible delicacies that inevitably attract birds and some than another herd of goats and sheep passing by. You can also find several animal skulls around the monument, completing the surreal scene. It is no coincidence that the Monument of The Imperial Map is located in Kharkhorin, as this city (then called Karakorum) was the capital of the Mongol Empire under Genghis Khan's successor, Ogedei Khan. The Imperial Map Monument is a great vantage point from which to look out over the city of Kharkhorin and the Orkhon River, and imagine what this collection of dirt roads and low-rise buildings may have looked like in its glory days. Also, today, we will visit to the legendary Erdene zuu (Hundred Treasures) Monastery, the Turtle monument, and the Karakorum museum, to see the relics of the ancient capital of the Mongol Empire. The Erdene Zuu Buddhist Monastery with its 108 stupas and the first Buddhist Lamasery (16th century) was the most important religious seat. Currently it constitutes an impressive sight, with its walls, stupas and temples, occupying an enclosure of 400 square meters, and surrounded by the steppe. The construction was continued by his son 'Ogedei' Khan, after his death. After 40 years, 'Kublai Khan' (grandson of Genghis Khan and host of Marco Polo) moved the capital of the Empire to Beijing (Peking-Yuan dynasty), already invaded. In the year 1792, there were 62 temples left and more than 10,000 Lamas. In the year 1930, the Stalinist purges destroyed most of their temples and the Lamas were banished to die in Siberia. Of its more than one hundred temples, only three have survived to our era, it remains the most outstanding cultural vestige of Mongolia. Mongolian lunch is included in front of the Erdene zuu monastery. Overnight in Tourist Gers Camp in Karakorum.













23 July, Day 5-Yak Festival-Orkhon Waterfall. (B)(L)(D)

Breakfast. 09:00AM-Meet Samar Magic Tours team. Drive to enjoy the Yak Festival is one of the most important festivals in Mongolia. It's held each year on the 23rd of July in Orkhon Valley, in Bat Ulzii sum, province of Ovorkhangai. In Mongolia, the yak has a great value for nomadic breeders. It has many uses and is necessary for the good development of a farm. The yak can carry equipment on its back or tract a cart. Its wood is used for doing clothes, and, as any animal, its meat and milk are eaten. Mongolian lunch is included. In the afternoon, we will head to Orkhon Waterfall. The Orkhon river derives its name from the Old Turkic prefix "or" meaning "middle", and "khan" or king. It rises in the **Khangai Mountains** in the Tsenkher sum (local town) of Arkhangai province at the foot of the Suvraga Khairkhan mountain. From there, it crosses the border into Uvurkhangai province and follows the upper Orkhon valley in an eastern direction until it reaches Karakorum. 24 July, Day 6-Turkish Memorial Museum - Ugii Lake - Karakorum. (B)(L)(D)

Breakfast. 09:00AM-Meet Samar Magic Tours team. Next, departure in the direction of the Turkish Memorial Museum (Khushuu Tsaidam) in the Orkhon River Valley, erected in honor of the Turkish princes of the early 8th century Bilge Khan and Kul Tigin with their Orkhon inscriptions, which are admitted as the most impressive monuments of the nomads of the Gokturk Empire. The Bilge Qaghan and Kul Tigin monuments were found in the UNESCO World Heritage Site of the Orkhon Valley Cultural Landscape, (47 km, 1 hour drive by paved road from Karakorum, funded by the **Turkish Government**) northwest of Kharkhorin (Karakorum). The museum was built in cooperation with the Turkish Cooperation and Coordination Agency in **2008**. For better conservation of the monuments, they were brought to the museum and copies of them were placed in the places where they were originally found. Next, departure by embankment (off road) towards Lake Ugii (about 32.3km, 1hr), an appropriate place for birds such as: swans, geese, cranes, ducks, pigeons, storks and other migratory species are cited in this area at the end of April, May and throughout the summer). Lake Ugii is located in the province of Uvurkhangai, where many migratory birds arrive at certain times. We visit the Ornithological local museum for observation. Continuous drive further to Karakorum (about 80 km/50 miles). Overnight in Tourist Gers Camp in Karakorum.













25 July, Day 7-Hustain Nuruu National Park - Ulaanbaatar. (B)(L)

Breakfast. 09:00AM-Meet Samar Magic Tours team. Next, drive to Hustain Nuruu National Park (about 300km/187 miles, 5 - 6 hrs) of the Wild Horses Przewaslki or Takhi (as known by the Mongolians). The Takhi is the last species of wild horse left on the planet. In 1878, the Polishborn Russian geographer and naturalist Nikolai Mikhailovich Przewaslki found a new species of wild horse in Mongolia, known locally as Takhi, and took several foals to European zoos. The only way to prevent the complete extinction of the last species of wild horse was to reintroduce it into the wild. In 1975, the **Dutchman Ian Bouman and his wife**, and other entities that joined later, created the Foundation for the Conservation and Protection of the Przewalski Horse (FPPPH), with the aim of saving the Tahki from extinction through acclimatization. of the zoo specimens in open field pastures, for later release into the wild. In 1992, the FPPPH brought the first 15 horses to the Hustain Nuruu area in Mongolia, to reintroduce them to their original habitat. Currently, the population of takhi in the wild in Hustai Nuruu National Park reaches 220 individuals. The practice of taming wild animals and then returning them to the wild is truly rare. Visit to a small museum, about the history of the Hustain Nuruu National Park, about the founders, and the reintroduction of the Przewaslki or Takhi wild horses in their original habitat. Excursion through the interior of the Hustain Nuruu National Park, exploration and observation of wild horses (*bring binoculars and drone). Return to Ulaanbaatar (about 120km/75miles, +2 hours drive). Transfer to the hotel. Overnight at selected and confirmed hotel. Dinner is not included.













26 July, Day 8-Ulaanbaatar City Tour. Last shopping! (B)(L)

Breakfast. **09:00AM**-Meeting with the **Samar Magic Tours** team at the hotel reception. Visit the **Zanabazar Museum of Fine Arts**, containing a large collection of Mongolian art, including the works of the 17th century sculptor and artist **Zanabazar**, as well as **the country's most famous painting**, **A Day in Mongolia**, **by B. Sharav**. We will visit the **Zaisan Memorial**, a monument south of the capital Ulaanbaatar. Next, we will visit the **Buddha statue** located at the base of the Zaisan Memorial, 75 feet high (23 meters high). Below the statue is a small room containing sutras and images of Buddha and his disciples. **Latest purchases of Mongolian souvenirs and pure Mongolian cashmere**. **Lunch at a local restaurant**. Transfer to the hotel. Accommodation in the selected and confirmed hotel. **Dinner not included**, **on your own**.











Day 9-Breakfast. The rooms must be vacated before **12 noon** on the day of departure. Meeting with Samar Magic Tours at the hotel reception. Transfer to Ulaanbaatar ``Genghis Khan´´ New Airport. **Departure Mongolia (B). Tour Ends.**

What's Included?

- **4** nights of accommodation at selected and confirmed hotel, based on double indicated room with breakfast.
- 4 nights of accommodation at the tourist Gers camp, based on standard ger for 2 people or more (according to the request!).

Meals as specified (8B,8L,4D), included 1 litre of mineral water a day, per person.

All transfers in private, traveling in a tourist bus or micro-bus (*depending on the group) in Ulaanbaatar, and the 40meter $/\sim$ 133,3 feet Genghis Khan Statue with all fuel included.



MONGOLIA TECHNICAL DATA SHEET

Currency: The official currency in Mongolia is the Tugrik or Tugrug (T), it is divided into mongos, cents. There are coins of 10, 20 and 50 mongos (MNT) and bills of 1, 10, 20, 50, 100, 500, 1,000, 5,000, 10,000 and 20,000 Tugrik. It is convenient to carry the euro and gradually change it. The change can be made at banks and hotels in Ulaanbaatar.

Climate: It is known as the land of the blue sky, but its climate is extreme and severe. Sybaritic winters cover the Gobi Desert with snow until April and keep lakes frozen until May. The rainy season is brief from mid-July to September with short, mild downpours. The nights are cool even in summer.

Approximate temperatures in Mongolia:

Spring: May [14th days, 6th nights, occasional rain, cold]

Summer: June-August [28-30° days, 18° nights, dry, occasional rain]

Fall: Sept. [21-16° days, 0° nights, dry, cold]

Luggage: The lighter the luggage, the better. A backpack without a frame or a rucksack or a travel bag is advisable, a small backpack to carry what each one needs during the day (camera, skin and lip cream, binoculars, water bottle, and flashlight). A raincoat or cape and a good anorak, warm clothing for high places, light cotton clothing, sunglasses and a visor for the hottest hours of midday, comfortable shoes. Clients are recommended to bring a binocular.

Small first aid kit: mosquito repellent, physiological serum, gauzes, aspirin, paracetamol.

Electricity: 220V, 50Hz. European round spike.

Clothing: There is no need to dress, be respectful of local customs.

Photography: The country is one of the most photogenic in the world with its landscapes, wildlife, culture and people. The entrances to the museums, National Parks and Monasteries are included in the trip according to the program, but the photographs are not. In many monasteries and temples photos are not allowed unless the price established for this purpose is paid. You have to look before you shoot because these ads are in Cyrillic or Mongolian, unintelligible to us, and once the camera is triggered, payment is immediate.

Food: The basis of food in Mongolia is meat. Lamb meat and flour are the basis of their meals. The Mongolian diet also includes horse meat. Milk and yogurt have an exquisite flavor, although a little strong. Cow and goat cheese is common.

Shopping: Keep in mind that there is hardly any haggling in the country. Even haggling will not be able to pay less than 70% of the price. In some stores you can find handicrafts, postcards and clothes. There are also rugs and fur and leather goods, as well as cashmere wool and camel hair products. Wooden toys, puzzles and games. Oils and watercolors. In the shops of the capital there are European, expensive products, especially in the State Department Store or in the SKY Center, and in other new shopping centers that have practically everything you want from both the Mongolian world and abroad.











Precautions: Mongolia is a safe place for tourism, because there are no drugs, muggings and no weapons, but like anywhere in the world, you need to be aware of pickpockets.

It is recommended immediately upon arrival at the hotel: to leave in the hotel safe (either in the room or at the reception): passport, visas, money, documents, valuables, etc., before leaving of visits by Ulaanbaatar. Be careful in restaurants, pizzerias, cafes, markets, in the central post office, and in monasteries there are pickpockets. Milk may not be pasteurized and therefore some of its derivatives may be dangerous. It should be boiled and take preferably cooked food. This is the health standard, but the reality is that once you stop at a Ger, any passenger is invited to enter and is offered aromatically "airag" or fermented mare's milk and goat, yak and sheep cheeses, all of them acidic. and dry. Refusing would not be correct.
